Federal Sentencing Guidelines for Organizations

- The FSG describe eight elements of an effective compliance program:
 - 1) Oversight by high-level personnel and direct reporting authority to governing board or appropriate subgroup such as audit committee
 - 2) Written policies and procedures
 - 3) Training and education
 - 4) Lines of communication
 - 5) Standards enforced through well-publicized disciplinary guidelines

Federal Sentencing Guidelines for Organizations

- 6) Internal compliance monitoring
- 7) Response to detected offenses including remediation of harm, and corrective action including assessment and modification of the compliance and ethics program if needed
- 8) Periodic risk assessments

Implementation	Centralized	Where some institutions have gone, but requires significant staff	This one wouldn't make much sense
	Decentralized	Oversight is at highest levels in compliance with FSG, but implementation is pushed out to subject matter experts	Where most institutions have been, but difficult to develop board-level reporting and accountability
