Deemed Export Control Questionnaire for H-1B and O-1A Petitioners Only

[to be completed by foreign national's NYU academic sponsor and returned with signatures to School/Departmental administrator who is centralizing the visa petition]

1. Background

Recent changes in the law require the University to determine whether an export control license is required for a visiting foreign national (hereafter referred to as "*Scholar*") at the time of the H-1B or O-1A visa application. Thus, the University cannot complete the application until this Questionnaire has been completed.

Those persons sponsoring a Scholar (who usually are the Principal Investigator, Chair, or Director, and hereafter referred to as "*Sponsor*") must understand his/her responsibility under the U.S. export control regulations, including the Department of Commerce Export Administration Regulations (EAR) and the US Department of State International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR), to the extent these laws apply to research conducted by the foreign national at the University.

Specifically, *Sponsors* must assist the University in determining whether there will be any exports, including "deemed exports." An "export" can occur not only under the traditional sense of shipping it overseas; an export can also be "deemed" to take place when it is provided to the *Scholar* within the United States. Even access that is solely visual can be deemed an export. Additionally, if technology (such as equipment) is used in research that is itself export controlled, granting access to the equipment can constitute an export.
